You'll find a great selection of Halloween season events in this brochure, but traffic congestion can be spooky and finding a parking place downright scary!

So, whether you're coming from New York City or from nearby rivertowns, choose a stress-free train ride aboard Metro-North's Hudson Line.

Get the express from Grand Central Terminal to Tarrytown (just 38 minutes) and you never know who you might meet! Or, take the train to Philipse Manor Station in Sleepy Hollow and you'll be steps from the action.

Both stations also now feature electric bike rentals available via the Project Mover app. Heading to the Blaze? Croton-on-Hudson is an express stop, as well.



WELCOME TO SLEEPY HOLLOW COUNTRY!

Just 25 miles up the Hudson River from New York City lies Sleepy Hollow Country, a place made famous by Washington Irving's "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow." Irving's story told of the Headless Horseman pursuing a terrified Ichabod Crane across the bridge towards the Old Dutch Church and the cemetery beyond.

When you visit Sleepy Hollow, you'll be able to see this very same church, stroll the nearby Sleepy Hollow Cemetery (or enjoy guided tours by advance reservation) and experience a series of special events in the Village and surrounding communities from Tarrytown to Croton-on-Hudson.

EXPLORE THE SLEEPY HOLLOW RIVERWALK AT EDGE-ON-HUDSON


